Grand Marshal **Olivia Hill**

Olivia Hill made history as the first openly Transgender person elected in the state of Tennessee, where she now represents the city of Nashville with 750,000 people. Olivia's journey into public service comes after 40 years in the utilities industry including a distinguished career in the U.S. Navy, where she saw combat in Desert Storm. Her tireless dedication to advocating for equality and the rights of the LGBTQ+ community is rooted in her own experiences as a Trans woman, and she remains committed to uplifting and empowering others in their personal journeys.



In addition to her political work, Olivia is a soughtafter public speaker, sharing her story across the country through her business, Olivia Speaks, She educates others on topics ranging from Trans rights to women's rights, all while working on her upcoming book and potential movie deal. Olivia's leadership, resilience, and passion for justice make her a powerful voice and role model, not just for the LGBTO+ community but for all those fighting for equal rights.

Grand Marshal Jacqueline St. James

Jacqueline St. James began her journey with the LGBTQ+ community in Johnson City in 1985. While attending college at ETSU, she quickly found her place within the community and came out as part of it.
