



### The TriPride Parade

The TriPride parade in Bristol is making history! Not only is it the first Pride parade in Bristol, but, to our knowledge, it's the first time in our nation's history a Pride parade has been in two states at once! That's right! As the parade is going down State Street, we're in two states at once. How cool is that?

Pride parades are an empowering event that break down barriers of prejudice and discrimination. It is an opportunity to be seen and to identify with a larger community. You make a difference with your participation, whether you're watching and cheering or participating in the parade.

Our third annual TriPride parade is composed of multiple contingencies including floats, decorated cars, and hundreds of walkers. Each group is encouraged to take this opportunity to be creative, self-expressive, and to celebrate our diversity!

Pride parades have a Grand Marshal near the beginning of the parade. This person is someone who has contributed to the community through advocacy for and support of our community.

This year we're fortunate to have two individuals, one representing Bristol, Virginia and one representing Bristol, Tennessee. We are grateful for the work Abby Powers and Brad "Hutch" Hutchinson have done, and continue to do, for our community.

### **Grand Marshal Brad "Hutch" Hutchinson**

Wheeling, West Virginia native, Brad Hutchinson, attended West Virginia University, earning a degree in English and a certificate in Women's Studies, and then a Masters in English Education.

Brad has lived in the Tri-Cities area since 1989 and is starting his 32<sup>nd</sup> year teaching for Bristol Virginia City Schools as a middle school and high school teacher. He also taught at Virginia Intermont College for over 20 years.

Brad currently serves as the co-president of the Bristol Virginia Education Association and serves on the Fitz Turner Commission for Human and Civil Rights as vice chair (Virginia Education Association). The Commission crafts civil rights statements for the Association and reviews all statements from other parts of the association concerning human and civil rights. He is also currently the commissioner for District A. As commissioner, he is charged with being the person members in our area come to with issues of civil rights. In turn, he makes recommendations regarding these concerns to the VEA Human and Civil Rights office in Richmond. Additionally, as the local Fitz Turner commissioner, Brad went to speak at several school boards in support of the Virginia Department of Education's transgender rights policy.

Brad has served on the LGBTQ+ committee for the Virginia Education Association since 2017, providing workshops and producing two LGBTQ+ toolkits for educators.

Brad married his husband, Joe Stone in 2015, as soon as it was legal, and has a daughter, Zoe Hutchinson, who is also involved in LGBTQ+ advocacy in the region.

### **Grand Marshal Abby Powers**

Abby Powers is a Bristol, TN native and a graduate of Tennessee High School's class of 2013. She completed a double major in History and English Literature at Western Carolina University.

Abby serves as the teen librarian at the Bristol Public Library. She is grateful to work in a profession where the diversity of our community is a top priority. She feels providing an inclusive space for everyone from all walks of life is critical to her success. Abby is honored to have a vital role at the Bristol Public Library and throughout the Bristol community. She says, "sadly I did not discover my own identity in the LGBTQIA+ community until later in life, and I want to ensure that our younger generations can learn to love themselves WAY earlier than I did. This is why I do what I do, and why I always promote the Bristol Public Library Teen Space as a comforting and inviting space for ALL."

### **Tyler Stephens**

From Eastern Kentucky, Tyler's music is a blend of the 90's Country Tyler grew up loving, mixed with just a taste of new country. Over the past 5 years Tyler has been touring extensively and playing some of the most popular country night clubs and casinos across the U.S. He strives to create music that the listener can relate to and live by and songs that speak the truth and tell the listener what he stands for and believes in.

### **Demon Waffle**

This energetic group provides a fun, highenergy live set that is matched by very few

bands. Blending reggae, rock, punk, soul,

funk and ska to make a sound that is easy to love and hard to duplicate, Demon Waffle is sure to get you moving as you're listening! Hailing from Johnson City, Demon Waffle is bustin' down the doors with their energetic music. Formed in late 2009, this 7-piece ensemble brings back a unique style of music to the area called ska: a blend of reggae, rock, and punk music. Popular in the late 90's, it never left the hearts and minds of a faithful few.

Singer-songwriter Beth Snapp might be considered to have pop infused roots, but her appeal has little to do with the box of a genre. It's a connection. 
